Bloc Loc HRT Rulers A and B will accurately trim oversized single direction and mirror image half-rectangle triangles by locking onto the diagonal seam allowance.

Directions

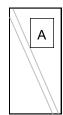
- 1. Press two fat quarters and layer them *right side up*.
- 2. Use the cutting chart measurements to determine the cut sizes of rectangles.
- 3. Cut the desired size rectangles, keeping them in pairs.



For every pair of rectangles cut, you will make 2 HRT

4. Turn the rectangles on end and decide on the seam direction. Match that direction to HRT Ruler A or B (or maybe both).

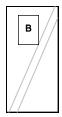




For units that have the seam direction like Ruler A, cut the rectangle diagonally in half in the same direction as you see it on the ruler.

5. For units that have the seam direction like Ruler B, cut the rectangle diagonally in half in the same direction as you see it on the ruler.





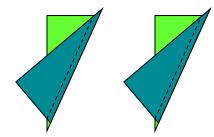
6. Open the pairs and arrange them as shown below.



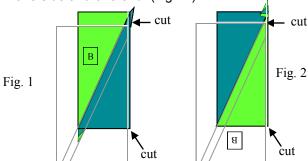


Example: One rectangle pair cut for Ruler B.

7. Flip each triangle on the right so that it is right sides together with its mate on the left and off-set the triangle tips. Stitch 1/4 "seam.



- 8. Press seams in the direction you want them to go.
- Place Bloc Loc[™]HRT Ruler on top of a unit so that the seams are locked into the groove fully. Slide the ruler so that there is enough fabric on the opposite end to trim and then make your first cut across one side and one end (fig. 1).



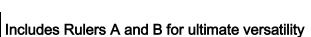
Keep the ruler on top of the unit & turn it around. Slide the ruler until the correct measurement is on the unit and cut again (fig. 2).

Groove locks onto seam for precision

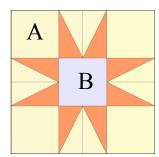

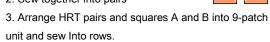
