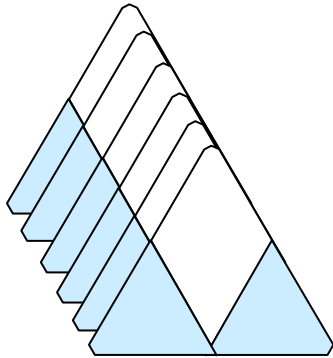
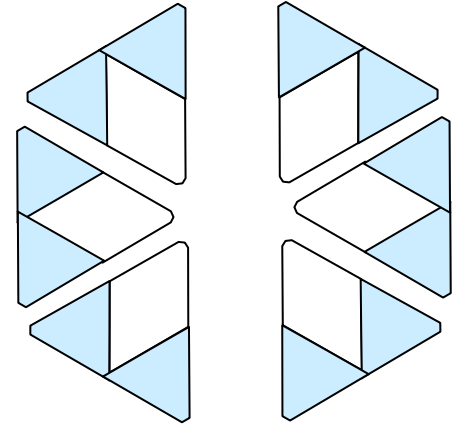
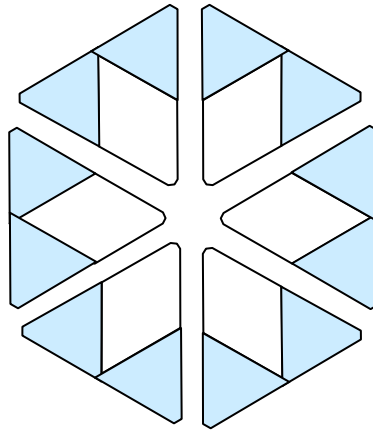




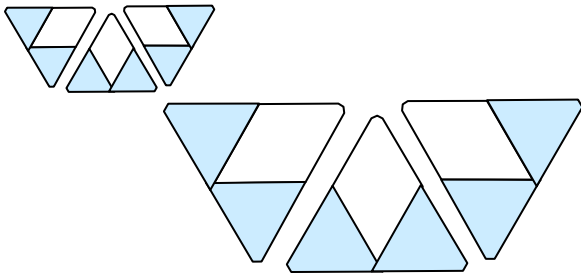
How to Make Hexagon Star Blocks



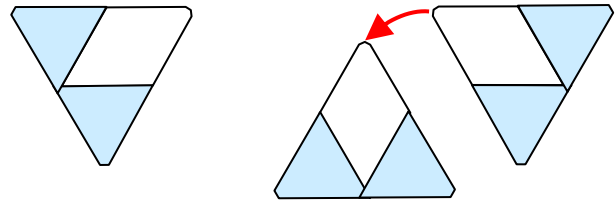
1. For each star, you will need 6 trimmed and re-pressed unit. See handout on Diamond in a Triangle Ruler Set Instructions for more information.



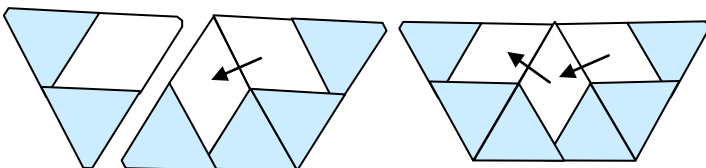
2. Arrange the 6 units into a hexagon shape as shown above. Divide the hexagon in half with three DIT units each.



3. Set one half (3 DIT units) off to the side for now and work with the other half.

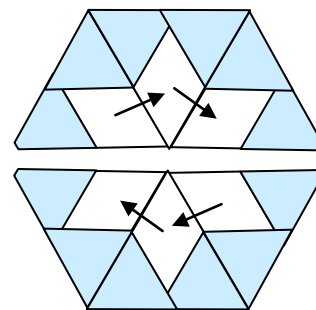


4. Isolate the first two on the right and flip right sides together. The seams will be going in opposite directions, so nesting them together will be a breeze. Pin if you like to hold them together.

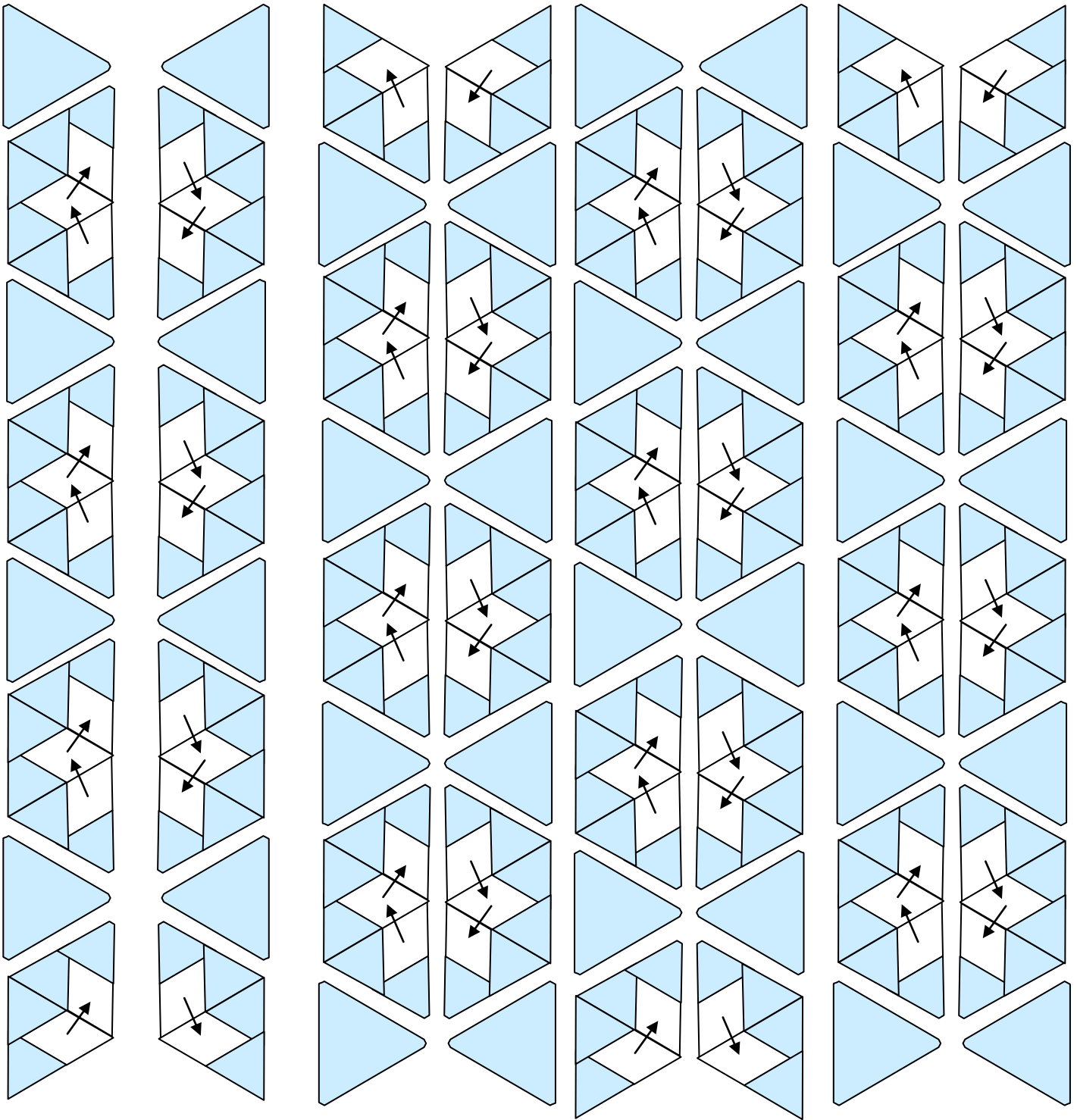


5. Press the seam to the left (clockwise directions). Nestle and sew the third DIT unit. Press that seam to the left (still clockwise).

Sew the remaining three DIT units (half hex) together and press the seams in the same clockwise direction.



6. Because both half hexagons were pressed in the same direction, the seams will interlock when they are facing each other. Do not sew the two halves together yet.



7. Keep making your half hexagons until the quilt is the correct size (from a pattern or your own needs) and then fill in between the half hex stars with the triangles cut from the grooved ruler. Nestle seams and sew the half hex and triangles into rows and then sew the rows together.

Trim across the top and bottom of the quilt 1/4" beyond the intersections. Layer with batting and backing and quilt the layers together as desired.
